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Demography

On Census Day 29th April 2001 the resident population of **Bleary** ward was 3721. Of this population:

- 26.1% were under 16 years old and 12.9% were aged 60 and over;
- 49.3% of the population were male and 50.7% were female;
- 20.2% were from a Catholic community background and 75.5% were from a 'Protestant and Other Christian (including Christian related)' community background;
- 25.1% of persons aged 16 and over were single (never married);
- 34.1 years was the average age of the population; and
- the population density was 2.1 persons per hectare.

The population for **Bleary** ward in 2010 was estimated at 4166, of which 23.0% were children, 30.2% were young working age adults, 32.3% were older working age adults and 14.5% were older people. Young working age adults are defined as 16-39 year olds, and older working age adults as males 40-64 and females 40-59 years. This represents an increase of 11.6% (433 individuals) from the estimated mid-year ward population in 2001.

In **Bleary** ward there were 53 resident births registered in 2009. Of these, 24 were male births and 29 were female births and 14 (26.4%) births were to unmarried mothers. The median age of mothers of new-born babies in 2009 was 31 and for fathers was 34.

In total 18 deaths were registered in 2009 in **Bleary** ward, of these 5 (27.8%) were under 75 years old. The median age at death was 85.

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Crime and Justice

There were a total of 106 offences recorded in **Bleary** ward in 2010/11. These can be broken down by various classifications of crime, shown below:

- Violent crimes (offences against the person) - 33 offences recorded.
- Criminal damage - 12 offences recorded;
- Burglary - 19 offences recorded;
- Vehicle offences (including theft)- less than 4 offences recorded and
- Other Theft - 12 offences recorded.

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Education and Training

On Census Day 29th April 2001, in **Bleary** ward looking at the population aged 16-74:

- 19.2% had degree level or higher qualifications; and
- 51.0% had no or low levels of qualifications. ¹

¹Low levels of qualifications are those categorised as Level 1 which include; GCSE (grades D-G), CSE (grades 2-5), 1-4 CSEs (grade 1), 1-4 GCSEs (grades A-C), 1-4 'O' level passes, NVQ level 1, GNVQ Foundation or equivalents.

For school leavers aged 16 and over in 2009/10, 82.4% achieved at least 5 or more GCSEs at grade C and above, 47.1% went on into Higher Education and 37.6% went into Further Education in **Bleary** ward.

In **Bleary** ward there were 165 students enrolled at a Higher Education college in 2009/10. Higher Education can be defined as education at a higher level than secondary school, usually provided in universities. Of all students enrolled, 79.4% were full time and 20.6% were part time students, while 55.8% were female and 44.2% were male. In total, 50.3% were aged 20 and under, 30.9% were aged 21-24 and 18.8% were aged 25 and over.

In **Bleary** ward there were 364 students enrolled at a Further Education college in 2009/10. Further Education can be defined as post-secondary education that is distinct from the education offered in universities. Of all students enrolled, 19.2% were full time and 80.8% were part time students, while 55.8% were female and 44.2% were male. In total, 59.6% were aged 19 and under, 9.9% were aged 20-25 and 30.5% were aged 26 and over.

In 20010/11 10.8% of pupils in post-primary schools had Free School Meal Entitlement (based on pupil residence data).

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Employment, Economic Activity and Social Welfare

On Census Day 29th April 2001, in **Bleary** ward looking at the population aged 16-74:

- 71.3% were economically active, 28.7% were economically inactive; and
- 1.6% were unemployed, of these 10.0% were long-term unemployed.¹

¹Long-term unemployed is defined as those who have been unemployed since 1999 or earlier on Census Day.

The Claimant Count records the number of people claiming unemployment-related benefits (which includes those who claim Jobseekers Allowance and National Insurance credits and severely disabled claimants but excludes students seeking vacation work and the temporarily stopped). In 2010, the average number of monthly unemployment-related benefits claimants in **Bleary** ward, as a percentage of the working age population was 2.4%. Of these, 22.9% were counted as Long Term Unemployed i.e. they had been claiming for over 12 months.

For **Bleary** ward in 2011 87 adults and 77 children under 16 were living in Income Support households.

Other sources of social security benefit information in 2011 are as follows:

- 71 persons aged 16-59 were claiming Income Support;
- 117 persons aged 16-59/64 were receiving Incapacity Benefit; and
- 93 persons aged 16 and over were claiming Housing Benefit.

The Census of Employment is a statutory survey that is conducted every two years in Northern Ireland. It provides information on the nature and characteristics of non-agricultural businesses. In 2009 there were 578 employee jobs in businesses located in **Bleary**.

Of these:

- 60% jobs were male full-time;
- 26% jobs were female full-time;
- 4.7% jobs were male part-time; and
- 9.3% jobs were female part-time.

The Farm Census 2010 recorded 35 farms registered to addresses in **Bleary** and the total agricultural labour force was 68 persons.

Deprivation - NIMDM 2010

The Northern Ireland Multiple Deprivation Measure 2010 (NIMDM 2010) report was published in May 2010. The report identifies small area concentrations of multiple deprivation across Northern Ireland. The results for **Bleary** ward are shown below.

On the Multiple Deprivation Measure ward level summary **Bleary** ward has an overall rank of 489 out of 582 wards. All wards in Northern Ireland are ranked, 1 being the most deprived (Whiterock in Belfast) and 582 the least deprived (Wallace Park in Lisburn). Wards with ranks of 58 or lower are in the top 10% most deprived wards in Northern Ireland, this means **Bleary**, with a rank of 489, is outside the top 10% most deprived wards. **Bleary** ward's rank of 489 places it in the 80% to 90% band.

Bleary ward lies in **Craigavon** LGD, which has 26 wards with ranks from 35 (Drumgask) to 531 (Waringstown).

All information for **Bleary** ward is shown in the table below. On the income domain **Bleary** ward is ranked 467, while on the employment domain it is ranked 421. Looking at proximity to services **Bleary** ward is ranked 209.

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Health and Care

On Census Day 29th April 2001, in **Bleary** ward:

- 16.3% of people had a limiting long-term illness, health problem or disability;
- 74.7% of people stated that their general health was good; and
- 11.9% of the population stated that they provided unpaid care to family, friends, neighbours or others.

Average life expectancy measures the expected years of life at birth based on the mortality rates of the period in question. Life expectancy for males in **Bleary** ward for 2007-2009 is 'Greater than NI average but less than 85' and for females is 'Greater than 85'.

In total 18 people died in 2009 in **Bleary**, of all deaths, 3 (16.7%) were to malignant neoplasms, 9 (50.0%) were to circulatory disease and 2 (11.1%) were to respiratory disease.

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On Census Day 29th April 2001 there were 1236 households in **Bleary**. Of these households:

- 90.8% were owner occupied and 9.2% were rented;
- 30.0% were owned outright;
- 7.5% were lone pensioner households;
- 4.0% were lone parents households with dependent children;
- 3.9% of households were without central heating or without sole use of bath/shower/toilet or without both;
- 3.5% of households had an occupancy rating of -1 or less (i.e. classed as overcrowded);¹ and
- 3.0 persons per household was the average household size.

¹The occupancy rating provides a measure of under-occupancy and overcrowding. For example, a value of -1 implies there is one room too few and that there is overcrowding in the household. The occupancy rating assumes that every household, including one person households, requires a minimum of two common rooms (excluding bathrooms).

In 2010 there were 1522 domestic properties in **Bleary**, which were sub-classified as follows:

- Apartments - 18
- Terraced - 89
- Semi-Detached - 397
- Detached - 1018

The average capital value (2005-based) of all domestic properties in **Bleary** ward was £ 133307 in 2010- the minimum capital value was £ 37500 and the maximum capital value was £ 1150000.

On Census Day 29th April 2001 in **Bleary** LGD 93.8% of households had access to a car or van and 82.7% of persons aged 16-74 in employment usually travelled to work by car or van.
